Financial support for Northern Friends Peace Board

We are very grateful for the financial giving from Friends and other supporters during the past year, and in particular the contributions from Area Meetings in the North who provide the larger part of our funding.

Guideline for financial contributions

This is a time of change and challenge, both in the world more widely and for Northern Friends Peace Board. It is in this context that we are suggesting a new guideline figure for financial contributions of £11 per member. We know that not all Area Meetings (or Local Meetings, where they are the main contributors) will be able to make a donation at that level. Equally, if some Meetings can give a little more, that is greatly appreciated.* We are diligent in our budgeting and expenditure but need to be realistic about the impact of inflationary price increases on our finances, and the fact that we are having to draw on reserves in order to continue delivering our work as we would wish.
